This parashah highlights the fact that the Israelite people donated not only their services, but also their most prized possessions to build the Tabernacle. The construction of the *Mishkan* necessitated a focus on collective, rather than individual action. It taught us, the Jewish people, the lasting lesson of the importance of volunteerism. The values of *tzedakah* (charity) and *gemilut hasidim* (acts of lovingkindness) combined to make volunteerism the communal culture.

The Sisterhoods of Women’s League for Conservative Judaism continue this ethos today. Sisterhoods are attentive to the needs of their synagogues; Sisterhoods are heedful of the hardships in their communities; And, Sisterhood members know the value of a well-established Jewish home. Together we strive to meet these needs through meaningful and engaging programming, volunteering, and generous donations.

So, the next time you feel the need to escape the daily grind, click your heels together three times...maybe you’ll find yourself in the comfort of your own home, maybe you’ll find yourself in your shul’s sanctuary. Either way, God will be there.
