

There are no premade kits. A supply list and instructions will be provided upon registration. A preview of the supplies is below.

#### Supplies

Sharpie brand markers only (Fine tip not extra fine tip) – assorted colors – Can be purchased individually or as a set at any craft or office supply store

White Ceramic Tile – 4 x 4 inches for place card, 6 x 6 inches for trivet – available at Home Depot – purchase a minimum of 4 for the project. Tiles are normally less than a dollar each, better to buy more than less. Rubbing Alcohol – 91% is better Medicine Dropper – clean (doesn't have to be new)

Self-Adhesive felt or cork feet for the base Paper towels

### **Optional Supplies**

Spray Bottle (to use with alcohol Krylon clear sealer – water base Blow Dryer Straw – any type Rubber gloves – use if you have an allergy to alcohol

### **Prior to the Session**

Please wash the tiles with soap and water. You want to remove any dirt or oil that will prevent the markers from applying evenly.




