MESSAGE FROM SHEILA KAUFMAN, GSR PRESIDENT

Dear Traci,

Shalom!

How often does Christmas, Chanukah and Kwanzaa coincide? This happened only five times since 1910! Remember that Kwanzaa is more of a recent holiday beginning in the 1960s. Each holiday is rich with traditions.

Chanukah is a Jewish festival that's been celebrated as long as Christmas, since the Second Century B.C., and runs for eight nights. The occasion commemorates the rededication and liberation of the Second Temple, in Jerusalem – following a rebellion led by the Jewish priest Mattathias and his five sons against King



Antiochus IV Epiphanes. Anticohus had invaded Judea, looted its temples, and banned the practice of Judaism. When Mattathias died, his last son, Judah, successfully completed his father's rebellion in 165 B.C., that ended with the Second Temple's liberation.

Christmas has always been about Jesus Christ, who was born by virgin birth to Mary, and her husband, Joseph. For Christians, the story of Jesus's birth is "the reason for the season" – one that's also associated with images of the Nativity, and displayed in many homes and public places, to mark the occasion.

And Kwanzaa dates back to 1966, when Maulana Karenga created it to help African Americans reconnect with their African heritage. The name comes from a Swahili phrase, "matunda ya kwanza", meaning "first fruits of the harvest." Kwanzaa observances take place over seven days, in honor of seven principles. Each day is dedicated to a principle, followed by the lighting of a candle. The seven principles are Imani (faith), Kujichagulia (self-determination), Kuumba (creativity), Nia (purpose), Ujima (collective work and responsibility), Ujamaa (cooperative economics), and Umoja (unity).

There are some reminders that I want to bring to your attention.

Hope you were able to attend our Coffee and Conversation, Alice Paul: NJ's Crusader for Equality. Thank you to Susan Winter and Helene Knee for organizing and blending in Jewish Suffragists. Below, you will find what you can do to get President Biden to inform the archivist to complete the amendment once and for all. This is too important not to let everyone know, so by all means, PLEASE forward this message to everyone that you can think of.

Hanukkah means dedication and we dedicate our time and energy to make sure the Conservative/Masorti movement continues to thrive by raising funds for Torah Fund. We are determined to make sure we have strong Jewish leaders going forward.

Consider donating to our Creating New Spaces campaign which will equally fund two important projects: the Women's League Study Space in the new undergraduate residence hall of the Jewish Theological Seminary and a special course of



training for students at the Ziegler School of Rabbinic Studies on gender bias and harassment. Our goal is to raise \$200,000 which will be split equally between the two projects. We are very close to accomplishing this objective. Our Creating New Spaces campaign has a balance of \$18,415 to reach our goal of \$200,000.



WHAT IS LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE?

An opportunity to Network with other women, master goal setting, time management and team building. Learn the secret of keeping yourself challenged.

WHAT MAKES IT DIFFERENT THAN OTHER LEADERSHIP WORKSHOPS?
