Note from Tova Rothschild, GSR Social Action Chair

Jewish philosophy emphasizes Tzedakah, the obligation to donate to the poor and needy, as a fundamental aspect of ethical living and a means of bringing social justice. This isn't seen as a charitable act but as a religious duty and a way to fulfill the covenant with God. Tzedakah is derived from the Hebrew word for "righteousness" and "justice," highlighting its core moral imperative. It's not just a matter of giving generously, but of ensuring that the needy receive what they are due. Donations are seen as a way to address social inequality and promote a more just society. Judaism emphasizes the inherent dignity of all individuals, regardless of their financial status. Judaism also teaches that donors benefit from tzedakah as much as or more than the poor receipients themselves, and this belief remains a common theme in Jewish tradition. Whereas the poor receive donations of material assistance or money, the donor receives the merit of sharing God's work.

In the spirit of social justice please consider bringing non-perishable kosher food items and/or feminine hygiene products to the Women of Achievement Gala on June 9, 2025.




