Our Torah Fund campaign theme for 2025-2026 is Oseh Shalom (Maker of Peace). Through Torah Fund, we help foster Jewish unity by our support of the five global Conservative/Masorti institutes of higher education.

If you would like to expand your Jewish literacy skills, and/or improve your ability to read Biblical Hebrew, you should take one of our classes.

**Classes begin on September 10,
2025.**

Our **Level 2+** is for students who have previously taken this class before and do not yet read smoothly. Prayers from Shabbat and holidays will be used to improve reading fluency and understanding.

Our **Level 3** class is for students who are proficient readers who want to improve their fluency through Shabbat and holiday prayers and have not previously taken this class before.

Our **Level 3+** class is for students who have taken this class before and wish to continue at this level.

Our **Level 4 - Chumash** class is for proficient Hebrew readers who want to strengthen their skills and learn vocabulary through the weekly Torah and Haftarah portions.

Our **Level 4 - Advanced Siddur** class is for students who previously took our Level 3 Grammar class and members with strong Hebrew reading ability. This class will delve into prayers by examining word roots, prefixes, suffixes and essential grammar.

**A minimum of 6 students is required

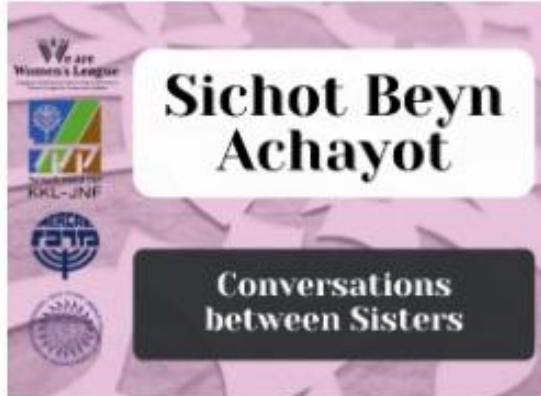

☆ **Prayer for the Return of Slain Hostages** ☆

Barokh atah Adonai, sovereign of time and space, the Judge of truth.

Arise Malkinu, hear our voice, be kind and have compassion for us, willingly and lovingly accept our prayer.

Arise Malkinu, do this for the sake of those who were martyred for Your holy name and for the sake of those who were slaughtered for their exclusive devotion to You.

Arise Malkinu, do not turn us away empty-handed, and have compassion for us, our infants and our children.

May it be Your will, *Adonai* our God and God of our ancestors, watch over, safeguard, strengthen and embrace and comfort the families of the slain hostages who were kidnapped and murdered by ruthless enemies and returned for eternal rest in Your holy land after 503 days.

The One who heals the broken-hearted and binds their wounds, encircle their loved ones with Your kindness, alleviate their suffering, dress their wounds and grant them and us comfort and healing for our agonizing bodies and crying souls.

There is no greater mitzvah than the redemption of captives. Master of mercy, ensure that the rest of our brothers and sisters return swiftly from captivity, those in joy to life and rehabilitation, and those in sadness – to eternal rest.

And may it be fulfilled that 'the sons [and daughters] come back to their place.' And let us say: Amen.
